Safe Technology and Digital Citizenship Plan 2022 – Sam Quantz, District Chief Information Office, and Julie Enzelmo, East High Librarian

- District uses Content Keeper Internet Filter
- School can have sites blocked and unblocked as needed
- YouTube is blocked for students but available for teachers
- Google Safe Search is used and helps block inappropriate content searches
- Nearpod teaches common sense media
- Report is sent daily to the principle of inappropriate search attempts
- District Chief Information office receives a report of staff members inappropriate searches
- School is close to 1:1 laptop – Pam Pedersen has a plan in place on how they will use laptops at the school
- Julie Enzelmo shared that they are still short to meet the technology needs for the teachers in the classroom

Discussion topics

- Are students being taught how for find credible sources?
 - Education is being provided
- Do students need to have cellphones out in class
 - Could the SCC do research on what other schools are doing and make recommendations to the principle

Principals Report - Pam Pedersen, Principal

State School report card

- East achieved a C (46%-56%)
- The school needs to be at 57% - 63% to reach a B

Areas that are used for the report card

- Achievement – this is an area for improvement, we are below district average
- Growth – had the highest score possible
- English Learners – above district average
- Post-Secondary Readiness
 - ACT 18+ - 56.4% up 3.6% from 2021
 - 4-year graduation rate – 88.7% up 4.4% from 2021
 - Readiness – 82.6% down -5.6% from 2021

Expectations for Dances and Games – new BEAST matrix showing the positive steps students need to be taking to participate in events. The hope is this will help improve student behavior.
